PRAYER MOMENT

(after breakfast in the meeting room)

Guide 1: The first years of Maria Domenica's life that we are contemplating are revealed as a gradual and progressive opening to the life of grace and faith, helped by the education of her parents, the accompaniment of Father Pestarino and the parish environment. These are the years of initiation to the faith that will be the solid foundation in the molding of her personality, of her future vocation and educational mission.

Guide 2: Today we are invited to discover how the hand of God weaves the existence of Maria Domenica. Before she can be aware of it, on the very day of her birth, He calls her to be a “daughter of God”, he calls her to manifest the wonders of His goodness and to be able to say with her life: “Lord, all my trust is in You”.

Guide 1: May we today experience and discover God's predilection for each one of us, that we have been chosen and loved out of pure gratuity. Therein lies our greatness and dignity as daughters of God.

(Each sisters completes her baptismal certificate. Once all have finished the certificates are given back to the guide.)

Guide 2: In this moment of silence and acceptance, while we hold in our hands the certificate of our birth to faith, let it resound in our hearts:

- Observe these statutes and ordinances
- Today you have accepted the LORD's agreement
- He will be your God, and you will walk in his ways
- You will be a people holy to the LORD

(brief pause)

Chorus 1: Lord our God, from whom comes the initiative to love: You seek us and say to us: "I am your God, you are my people". You love us in Jesus Christ, your Son. Lord, may our response of love go far beyond the demands of any law.

Choir 2: Like Maria Domenica, may we know how to seek you and be in communion with you in the depths of our being. May we express our gratitude to you by going out from ourselves to our brothers and sisters, reaching out to young people with a sincere and committed love like yours.

Guide 1: To you, Lord, who are the true light and the very source of all light, we humbly ask that meditating on your word we may live ever faithful in the clarity of your light. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son. Amen.

VISIT TO THE PARISH CHURCH

(bring main candle and tea light candles, lighter, container with holy water)



(Visit and explanation of the Church will take place before the renewal of Baptismal Promises)

RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL PROMISE

(in the parish Church close to the Baptismal font)

Guide 1: As we gather here around the baptismal font of the Parish, we think of the countless people of Mornese who were baptized here. Among many, we naturally focus on the baptism of Maria Mazzarello.

- Here she was introduced by her parents,
- Here she was baptized in the name of the Trinity,
- Here she becomes a daughter of God,
- Here she was welcomed into the parish community full of faith
- Here she received the call to grow in love and trust in God
- Here she, like Jesus, was called to serve those who were at risk or in need
- Here she was called to honestly face herself and life's challenges
- Here she receives the invitation to open herself to the action of the Spirit within her
- Here she understood that her life was a gift to give to others
- Here she grew into a deep, personal love for Jesus
- Here she received from Don Pestarino the accompaniment she needed to see God's plan in her life
- Here she met others who, with their love and support, helped her strengthen her faith

Guide 2: Hold a picture in your mind of your parish church or the place where you were baptized and think of all the blessings this has brought into your life.

(Brief pause for silent reflection)

Guide 1: Let us first think about the promises our parents made for us at our baptism:

- They promised that we would renounce evil, that we would develop our faith by learning to pray and love God

Let us renew our Baptismal Promises now here in the place where Main became a daughter of God

V. Do you reject Satan?

R. I do.

V. And all his works?

R. I do.

V. And all his empty promises?

R. I do.

V. Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth?

R. I do.

V. Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary was crucified, died, and was buried, rose from the dead, and is now seated at the right hand of the Father?

R. I do.

V. Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?

R. I do.

V. God, the all-powerful Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has given us a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and forgiven all our sins. May he also keep us faithful to our Lord Jesus Christ for ever and ever.

R. Amen.

Guide 2: In the silence let us approach the baptismal font one at a time bringing our candle and paper and, immersing our hand in the water, let us sign ourselves with the Cross of our faith. As you do so, in your heart thank the Lord for those who have accompanied you and about your commitment to living your faith more radically. We in turn will pray for those at the baptismal font.

(As each sister approaches the Baptismal Font she will light her candle and place her candle on top of her piece of paper close to the Baptismal Font. After she has blessed herself and leaves the Baptismal Font her baptismal certificate is returned to her.)

VISIT TO THE CEMETERY

(brief explanation about the cemetery)



SPECIAL ROSARY

(near the tomb of Don Pestarino and the names of the Sisters)

Guide 1: We are called to live life as a vocation with our specific Marian identity and to rediscover the Salesian charism in all its apostolic missionary dynamism (Acts GC XXIV p.8). Main cultivated devotion and had deepened the figure of Mary as Immaculate, Sorrowful Mother, Madonna of the Rosary. In these 3 Marian moments with Main we ask Mary our Mother and protector to be like her a prophecy of presence that generates life. We also pray for and with the people who preceded us in the final meeting with the Father.

First Moment: The Annunciation



Guide 2: We contemplate the angel's message to Mary who announces that she has been chosen to be the instrument of the Word who became flesh. She got scared, wondered how this could happen, and then accepted the calling as a servant of God, the handmaid of God. A wonderful process of faith, hope and love.

Guide 1: At Mazzarelli and Valponasca, Maria Domenica entered into her continuous process of growing faith, hope and love, deepening her love for her Eucharistic Lord and seriously committing herself to a conversion of the heart,

from being self-centered to being Theocentric, from wanting to make a good impression, to accept her vulnerability. (*Our Father, 10 Hail Marys, Glory Be*)

Second Moment: Mary at Cana

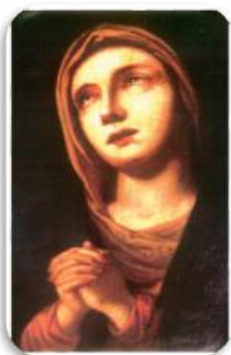


Guide 2: Mary's presence at the feast of Cana challenges our female identity and proposes an attitude of openness and active concern. It is a call to express the depth of our entire being. Maria becomes directly involved in this celebration which is about to be compromised by the lack of wine, a sign of joy. As a woman, she pays attention to details and as a mother, she cares about the happiness of others. (Acts of GC XXIV, No. 5)

Guide 1: At the Mazzarelli family, Maria Domenica gradually became attentive to the needs of her sisters and brothers, helping her mother in whatever way she could. This concern in Valponasca has increased not only in helping the father in the fields and in still assisting the mother at home, but it is increasingly expanding through the friendship with Petronilla Mazzarello and the always active and attentive participation in the Pious Union of the Daughters of Mary Immaculate. (*Our Father, sing the Hail Mary, Glory*)

Sing: Hail Mary

Third Moment: Mary at the foot of the Cross



Guide 2: Mary is present at the foot of the Cross, not only as a loving Mother but also as a disciple who follows her Master until the hour of his exaltation before the Father. Jesus calls from the Cross, entrusting Mary to his disciple John as his mother and entrusting his disciple to Mary as his son. Along with this, as the Lord completed His earthly ministry, His words to Mary, "Woman, behold your son," and to John, "Behold your mother," were profoundly illustrative of the new family of God being born at the foot of the cross, the church. Mary truly becomes the Mother of this Church. A new era filled with the Holy Spirit was beginning...

Guide 1: In Valponasca, things went well in the family and the parish for Maria Domenica until the family lost all their earnings due to some unexpected theft. His parents saw this as a total disaster. Maria Domenica saw it as an opportunity to be closer to Jesus in the Eucharist and to the people of the parish, especially the young people. A new era filled with the Holy Spirit was beginning. (*Our Father, 10 Hail Marys, Glory Be*)

PERSONAL REFLECTION

(to take place in the afternoon)

1. When and where were you baptized? What name were you baptized with and what does this name mean?
2. Who are the people who helped you grow in faith as a child?
3. Indicate two or three aspects of the faith that they passed on to you. What aspects have remained part of your experience as a Christian or religious to this day? Name them and thank God for this blessing.
4. Can you recall an experience of who God was to you as a girl? Describe it with an image, a word, a phrase or a passage from Holy Scripture. Main fell in love with "her" Eucharistic Jesus- but struggled to receive the sacrament of Reconciliation. Is there a sacrament that you absolutely love and another that you struggle with? Stay with your answer and think about why this is so.

GROUP WORK

Guide: In small groups share a significant experience of this rich journey of strongly feeling the love of a God who has made us not only his creatures but his daughters in baptism. In this moment of attentive listening to my sister. Let us allow the spirit of God to act in us and enrich us with His fraternal and profound love.

EVENING PRAYER MOMENT

(outdoors, if possible)

Sign of the Cross

Guide: We come here as pilgrims. Let us spend some personal, quiet time opening our hearts and our very being to Mornese, to its people, to its sights, to its sounds... to Main of Mornese... to its vision for young people and the poorest of the people of God... to her dynamic relationship with the Lord... the Lord she found right here in this simple place. He brought us into his life-generating presence.
